What excites you most about sponsoring a child in need?


To have an impact on a single person's ability to raise and realize their full God-given potential seemed too good to pass up.

May & June Birthdays


In May we celebrated **Daines** turning 7 and **Violet** turning 8, and in June we have **Happyness** turning 7 as well as **Junior** turning 8!
